# Multidisciplinary databases

- **Academic Search Complete**: FT for nearly 4,500 journals (including almost 400 legal journals)
  - **Academic OneFile**: less academic content compared to Academic Search Premier
  - **Expanded Academic ASAP**: over 2,200 full-text titles in a wide variety of subject areas including: social sciences, humanities, science and technology
  - **Scopus**: more science & technical journals but does include over 2,800 social science journals



# Business Databases

- **Business Source Complete:** full-text of over 2,800 journals
- **Canadian Business Resource (CBR):** profiles of over 50 Canadian companies; 2,500 firms; 40,000 contact names

peace and conflicts studies research.




# Public & International Affairs

- **Canadian Public Policy Collection:** collection of monograph publications from Canadian public policy institutes, gov't agencies, advocacy groups, think-tanks, university research centres and other public interest groups.
- **PAIS:** indexes articles and books on political, social, and public policy issues
- **Columbia International Affairs Online (CIAO):** publishes working papers from university research institutes, occasional papers series from NGOs, foundation-funded research projects, proceedings from conferences, books, journals and policy briefs.



# Government Information

- **Canadian Census Analyser:** Provides access to commonly requested census data, 1971-2001
- **Canadian Research Index:** Index of provincial and federal documents
